There have been a number of "interesting" factors that has meant a variety of plans were discussed but I am confident we have, in the end, a great teaching team who will cater for the needs of the children, whatever class they are in. **Our focus for 2022 is CREST – TO REACH THE TOP**

The organizing process is not easy as we can't please everyone, we are limited with our resources, we have large numbers in certain year groups and we need to think of the big picture – both academically and socially. My aim, as a leader of the school, is to “do the right thing” (even when it's hard), rather than just “do things right.”

Staffing – Each year the Ministry uses a formula and provides us with beginning of the year staffing (teaching) based on the number of children we have at our school. This is reviewed with roll returns twice a year. Again we are lucky to be extremely well staffed next year, however there needs to be some forward strategic planning, as in 2023 I know we will not be so fortunate. However for next year we have plenty of feet on the ground, which will enhance the teaching and learning opportunities. There are also many other advantages to this organization which has been discussed thoroughly with staff and Board. For the beginning of 2022 we have the following staffing:

One of the most important factors we have considered in our planning was:

Low class numbers – we decided that it is advantageous for everyone to have low class numbers and have ensured this by having 7 “home rooms.” Most rooms will have an average of 20 children in them – this is incredibly fortuitous and somewhat unheard of in North Canterbury. Let's enjoy this and make the most of it while we can!

Classes – At the same time we are looking at our staffing, we also think about classes and how children and year groups will fit into this model. This is a very interesting and thought-provoking process each year. A large number of factors have been considered when putting these lists together, which I am more than happy to discuss on an individual basis. **Please note – these are draft and could change.** (see later in newsletter)

There have been some major “big picture” considerations in making these decisions, such as:

1. Meeting social and academic needs
2. Straight Year 6 class – which will be more involved in the “senior school” – extending those children who need to be and role modelling expectations of senior children
3. Year 7/8 split classes – a number of factors influenced this decision, however be assured that these classes will run “parallel programmes.” **Both number 2 and 3** will be “supported/maintained/sustained” by Mrs Bell in Literacy (and to be honest, you would not find a better Literacy teacher than Miriam!) and myself in Maths.

Please note - we have used this structure before and it is a very powerful way to:

- increase leadership within the Year 8 group,
  - support meeting the needs of the children, both socially and academically,
  - allow for role modeling higher expectations and standards of work
  - utilize teaching strengths and run programmes that have POWER, PASSION and PACE.
4. Support for the junior reading programme will once again be provided. Reading is a priority and we made significant progress this year, so want this to continue.

5. This organization also allows for movement of children, as the new entrant room grows we will have the ability to move children through the classes as the year progresses
